Learn to be a leak detective! Leaky toilets, especially faulty flappers, are prime water wasters inside the home. Does your toilet make noises when no one is around? Does the tank

constantly refill even though no one has flushed it? If so, you have evidence of a leak. To investigate, put a couple of drops of food coloring or a toilet dye tablet in your toilet tank and wait a few minutes to see if the color seeps into the bowl. If it does, it's time for a new flapper. Even a minor toilet leak can waste up to 18,250 gallons in a single year. That's enough to fill a swimming pool!
