SOURCING YOUR TAP WATER

With information about New Mexico's drought making news, you may be wondering where the water in your tap comes from. All water for our Clovis, New Mexico customers currently comes from the Ogallala (also called High Plains) Aquifer. Additionally, long-term plans for the City of Clovis include surface water from Ute Reservoir through the City's membership in the Eastern New Mexico Water Utility Authority. All water for our Edgewood and Thunder Mountain, New Mexico customers currently comes from the Estancia Basin Aquifer.

Surface water, generally, is considered to be a more sustainable type of water than groundwater. In New Mexico, underground aquifers are used for storage of excess water as well as sources of groundwater.

As EPCOR looks to the future for our New Mexico customers, we are focused on diversifying our water supply sources and integrating those sources effectively for continued reliable delivery of safe, clean and affordable water for you.
