Application for Victoria E511S substation expansion in the downtown Edmonton area has been received

The Alberta Utilities Commission, the independent utilities regulator, will be considering the substation expansion development application in Proceeding No. 3478. If you feel you may be affected by this application you can provide input to the AUC to review before it makes its decision.

EPCOR Distribution & Transmission Inc. (EPCOR) has applied to expand the Victoria E511S substation under the *Hydro and Electric Energy Act*. EPCOR has proposed to expand the fence line of the Victoria E511S substation and construct a 32 metre by 13 metre building to house new electrical equipment. The Victoria E511S substation is located at 10520 104 Street NW, Edmonton.

Written submissions are due on January 30, 2015.

If you wish to participate in this proceeding you may be eligible for funding to support your position, which includes costs for legal representation and expert witnesses.
