

# PROJECT UPDATE

## 650 Substation Equipment Removal – Delayed AUGUST 2023

In April 2023, EPCOR sent you information regarding an upcoming project at the substation in your neighbourhood. We have an updated timeline to share with you regarding this work.



### PROJECT OVERVIEW

EPCOR is responsible for building, maintaining and upgrading the electrical transmission and distribution system in Edmonton. Part of this system includes substations, which convert electricity from higher voltage power lines to lower voltages that can be safely distributed to homes and businesses in the area. Due to ongoing upgrades in the Glenora neighbourhood, the substation located at 10322 – 135 Street is no longer needed.

EPCOR is preparing to sell the property and will be removing the equipment inside the building and within the substation yard. This work will be noisy at times as it involves removing metal equipment and demolishing a retaining wall.

### PROJECT DELAYED

While originally expected to begin this summer, this work is now delayed until spring 2024. Prior to starting work, EPCOR will provide advance notice to the community.

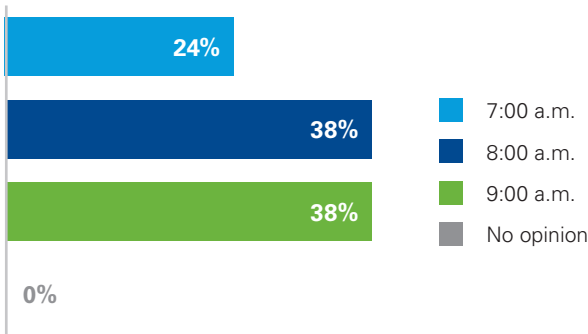
- **200** Notices distributed

## SURVEY RESULTS

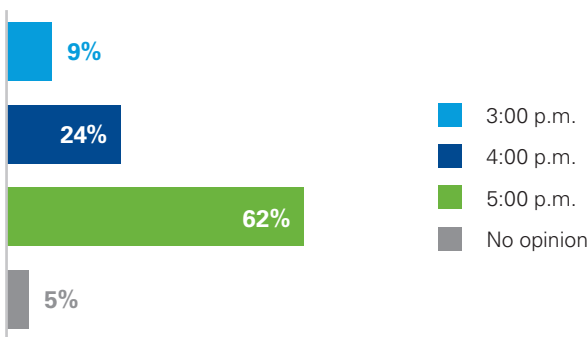
Based on community feedback, EPCOR will start the work on the substation at **9:00 a.m.** and finish by **5:00 p.m.**, from **Monday to Friday**.

### Preferred start time for work at the substation (n=21)



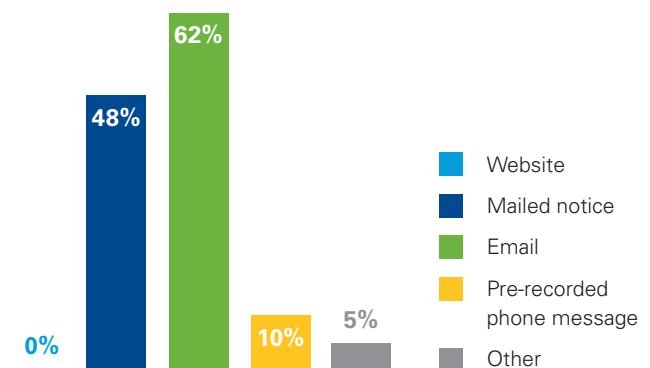
### Preferred end time for work at the substation (n=21)
