Notice is hereby given to all water service customers of EPCOR Water New Mexico Inc. ("EPCOR") of the following: 1. On August 31, 2018, EPCOR filed with the New Mexico Public Regulation Commission its Advice Notice No. 40 and

- 2. The Commission has suspended the Proposed Rates pending a public hearing and designated the undersigned as
 - Hearing Examiner for this proceeding.
- 3. Through the Proposed Rates, EPCOR is requesting additional annual revenues from its water utility operations in its Clovis service district of \$910,113, representing an increase of 8.47% above its adjusted water service revenues for the 12 months ending December 31, 2017. The proposed rate increase will affect all of EPCOR's customer classifications in the Clovis service district.
- 4. The following tables compare the proposed General Water Service rates with the current General Water Service rates for each customer classification in the Clovis service district. The Clovis municipal franchise charge of 2% will appear as a separate line item on bills to customers within the Clovis city limits.

the average residential customer. At the time a decision is issued in this proceeding, the purchased water and power cost adjustment clause factor will be set to zero under the Company's proposal. Any future impact to rates will be calculated after new rates have been in effect for a full year. Until that time, customers would see no bill impact.

7. EPCOR is requesting approval of changes to its existing purchased water and power cost adjustment clause

power costs to be added as an extra charge to all rates to recover or refund the cost of water purchased for resale in its Clovis system and changes in power costs. The changes will update the base cost of purchased water and power included in EPCOR's current service rates from \$0.3955 per Ccf to 2017 expense levels of \$0.4687 per Ccf. On the date of application (August 31, 2018), the customers were receiving a credit of \$0.0275 per Ccf or \$0.19 for

- Original Rate Riders 8 through 10, included in the Proposed Rates, propose three new customer assistance programs that will affect service rates but which EPCOR intends to be revenue neutral. The first is the Low Income Program which will offer monthly credits of \$10.00 to a limited number of qualified low income applicants and will be supported by a monthly rate surcharge of \$0.16 per month applicable to all Clovis customers. The second is the Deployed Service Member Credit Program which will provide temporary rate relief for a limited number service members serving away from their primary residence for an extended period of time and whose residence is unoccupied during the period of deployment. The cost of this program will be deferred for recovery in EPCOR's next rate case, but is estimated to cost approximately \$96,000 per year if fully subscribed, which would result in a monthly rate surcharge of \$0.51 per month applicable to all Clovis customers. The third is the Disabled Military Veteran Credit Program which will offer monthly credits of \$10.00 to a limited number of service members who have suffered a disability as a result of their
- collected from May 29, 2012 through December 31, 2017. It will result in a monthly credit of \$1.68 to residential and commercial customers. 10. Original Rate Rider 12, included in the Proposed Rates, proposes to establish an annual water revenue adjustment mechanism (WRAM) designed to enable annual adjustments to EPCOR's rates intended to adjust for changes in customer usage patterns and reduce the frequency of rate cases. The impact to rates will be calculated after new rates have been in effect for a full year. Until that time, customers would see no bill impact. Based on the historical declining usage experienced by the Company over the past ten years, estimated potential bill increases for an average residential customer vary from approximately \$0.00 to \$0.35 per month. This represents an average residential bill increase of approximately 0.00% to 1.04% on a current monthly bill. 11. Although EPCOR is proposing no change to the rates effective in its Edgewood district in this case, cost and other determinations may be made in this case that could affect rates in the Edgewood district in future cases.
